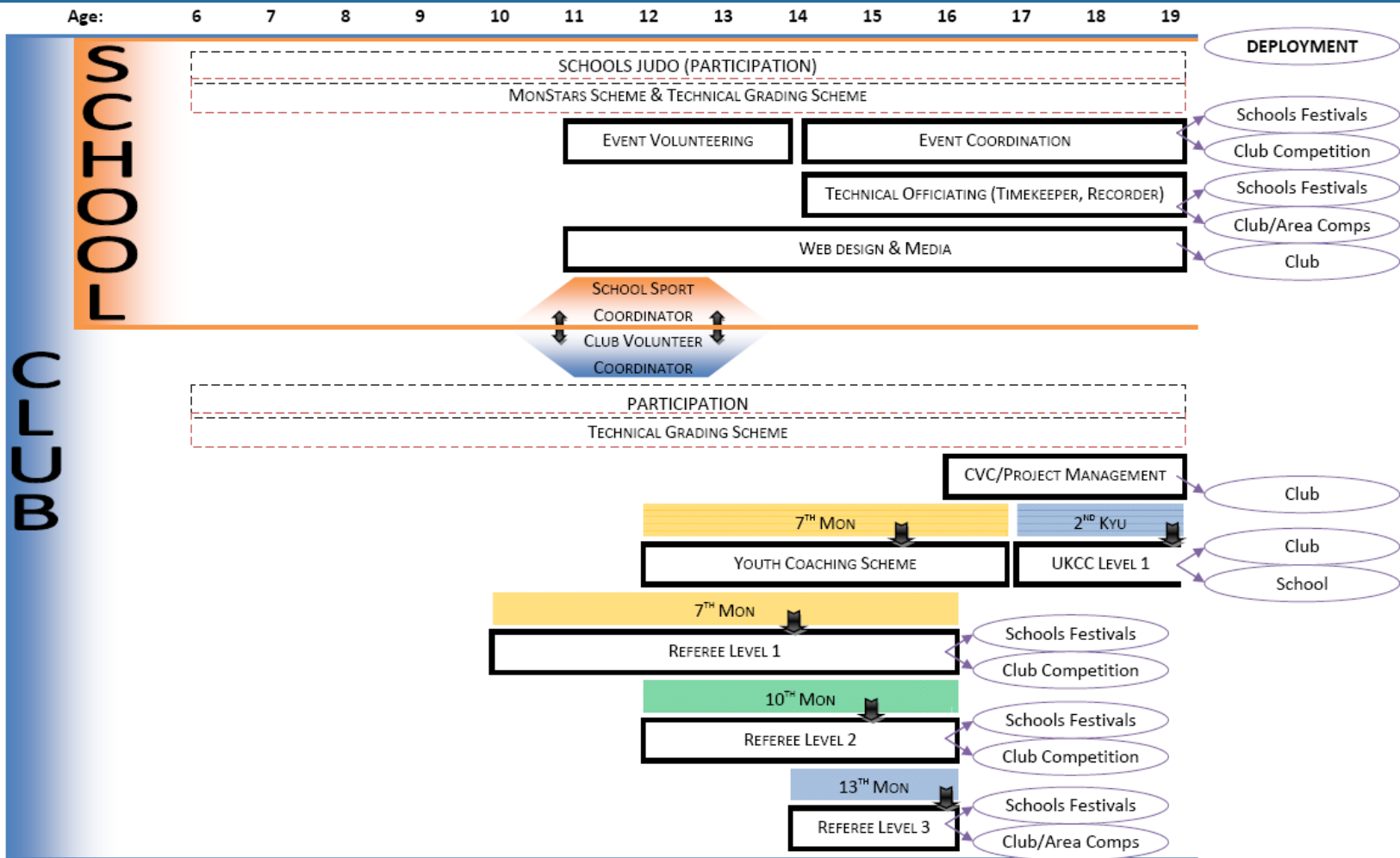

Young Volunteer Development Model



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Event Volunteering



- Opportunity for those in the school sector
- Increased bank of volunteers for judo events
- Links with Youth Sport Trust project for Event Volunteers at major events in 6 host cities
- Course acts as a bolt-on for students undertaking the Sports Leaders UK awards and contributes to volunteer hours for Step into Sport or Duke of Edinburgh awards

To be launched in March 2010



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Technical Officiating



- Timekeeper/Scorer Award first step on officiating pathway
- Open to those from a judo and non judo background over 14 years of age
- Essential volunteers to run an event
- Links with Youth Sport Trust Young Officials project
- Currently available although under redevelopment, to be relaunched March 2010



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Web Design & Media



- For those in the school environment
- Using Schools2Dojo programme link those trained with community clubs
- Identified as a need in clubs
- Aimed at supporting clubs in promoting themselves in the local media
- Link to Enhancing Delivery Environments Intervention
- In design phase to be launched with new website



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CVC / Project Management



- Introduction to volunteer roles needed to run a club
- Initial training for Club Volunteer Coordinator role to support volunteer workforce and link to Area / BJA
- Project management training to help clubs attain clubmark or other projects
- To be launched March 2010



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Youth Coaching Scheme



- No scheme for coaching under 17 years old
- Available from 12 yrs and 7 mon
- Tasks and activities designed to lead into
 - BJA level 1
- Scale of three levels, Gold, Silver and Bronze to be completed depending on time and experience
- To be delivered in club by their coach working through a programme over time, Gold sign-off to be carried out by BJA Technical Officers
- To be launched March 2010



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Youth Refereeing Scheme



- Current scheme in use across BJA does feed and support senior refereeing scheme
- Three levels of award starting at 10 years and 7 Mon
- Support local competition
- Looking to form a project team and develop standardised resources; aim March 2010



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Three Phase Approach



- Foundation phase:
 - Infrastructure Building
 - Tutor Orientation
 - Plan Review Cycle
- Implementation phase:
 - April 2010 onwards
 - Priorities include, 2 way communication, increased volunteer opportunities, logging and tracking system, increased training opportunities, reward & recognition and 1 year review
- Sustainability 2013 & beyond
