WHY JUDO?



- Number of medal available ie 56 and 52 medals
- 14 places qualified – largest medal sport
- Vision to move to centralised programme
- ‘People to make it happen’
- Stretch target to be identified/evidenced
- Gap analysis to podium

Beijing Player History – 2004-2008 (Men)



- Top 5 at 2008 Olympics and 2007 World championships : 15 - 36%
- No of players in the top 5 competing 1st Olympics : 24 - 57%
- No of players in the top 5 competing 2nd or more Olympics : 18 - 43%
- No of players who won medal at their first Olympics in Beijing : 14 - 50%
- No of players who won a medal in 2nd or more in Beijing : 14 - 50%
- No of players who won a medal in Athens and Beijing : 5 - 18%

Beijing Player History – 2004-2008 (Women)



- Top 5 at 2008 Olympics and 2007 World championships: 18 - 43%
- No of players in the top 5 competing in their 1st Olympics : 21 - 50%
- No of players in the top 5 competing in 2nd or more Olympics : 21 - 50%
- No of players who won a medal at their 1st Olympics in Beijing : 16 57%
- No of players who won a medal in 2nd or more in Beijing : 12 - 43%
- No of players who won a medal in Athens and Beijing : 7 25%

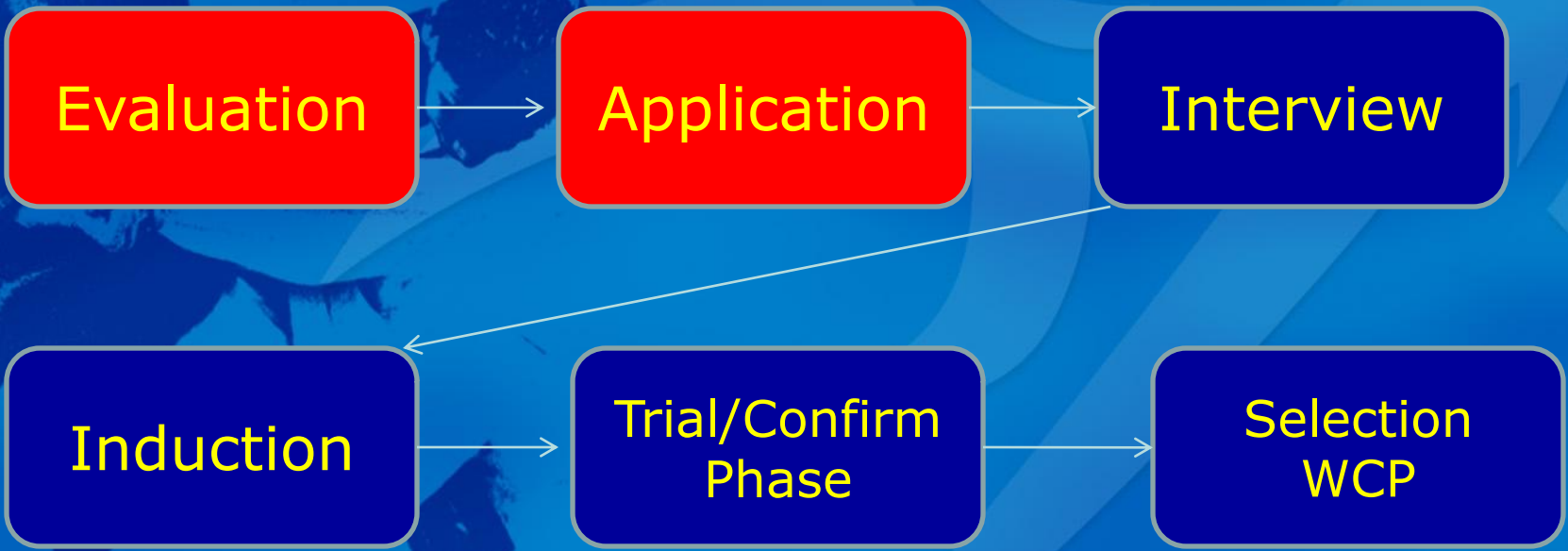

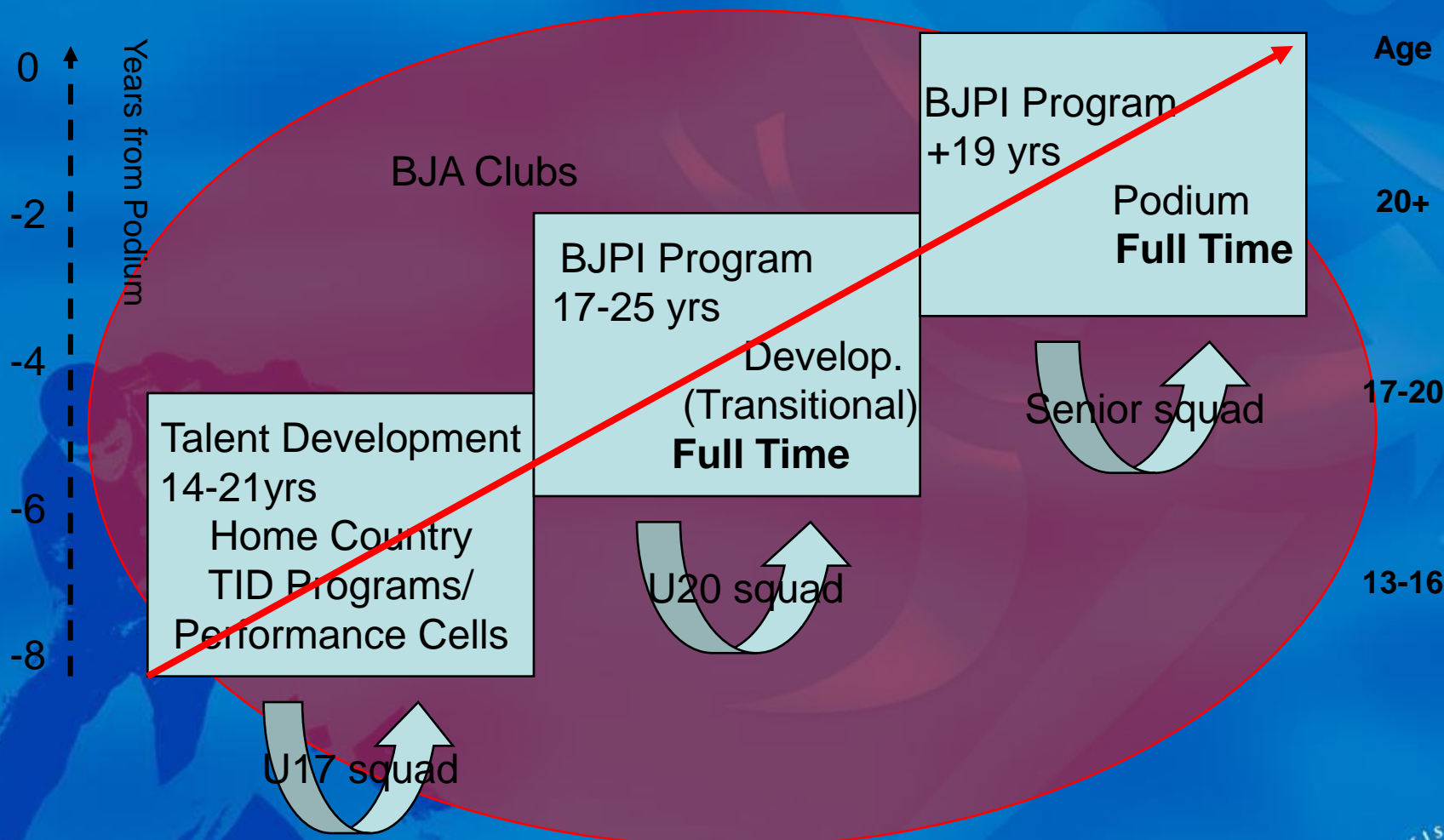
HOME COUNTRY PARTNERSHIPS

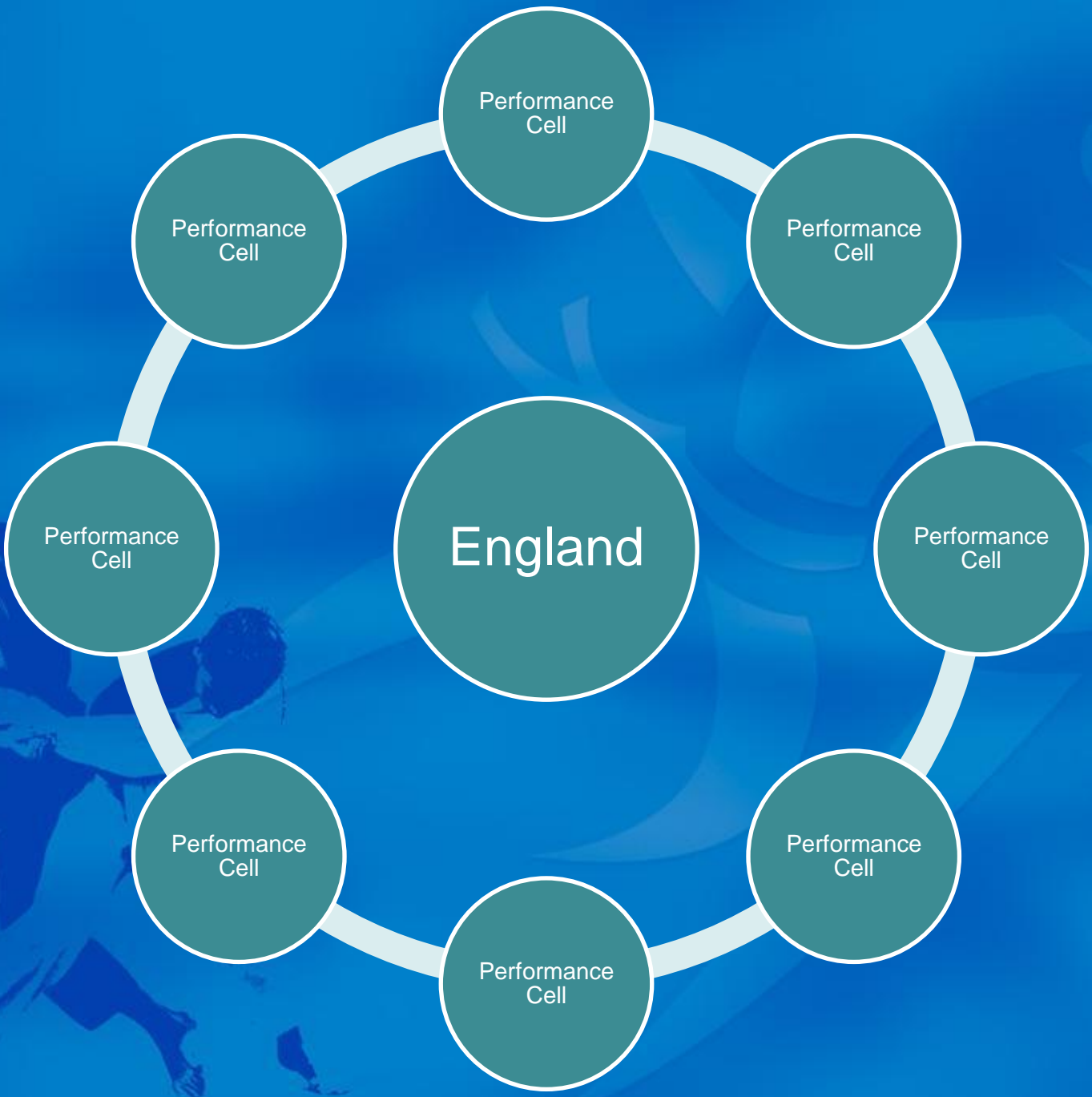
