## LOCOG

- responsible for preparing and staging the 2012 Games
- for staging a series of test events in the year before the Games
- recruiting and training volunteers
- overseeing the four year Cultural Olympiad





## ODA

- public body responsible for developing and building the new venues and infrastructure
- Olympic Park

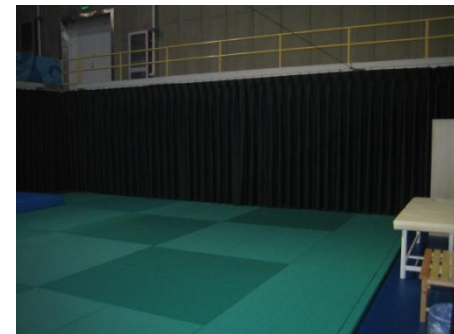
## Competition Venue - Excel

- largest competition venue
- 60,000m<sup>2</sup> exhibition space
- 5 arenas – 7 Olympic and 6 Paralympic sports
- Bespoke arena
- Seating capacity 10,000
- Distance from village 10km



## Training venue – to be confirmed

- 16 mats





## Olympic Judo

- 28 July – 3 August 2012
- 386 athletes (217 men and 147 women, 22 unallocated)
- Host country gets 14 places

## Paralympic Judo

- 30 August – 1 September 2012
- 140 athletes (84 men and 56 women)
- Host country gets 13 places

- Work programme - to be agreed by LOCOG/IJF and IBSF
- Part time 2009 – 2010, full time May 2010
- Equipment lists
